Analysis of Spay/Neuter Services & Animal Shelter Veterinarian Costs
Date: April 11, 2010

At the February 10, 2010 Animal Care JPA meeting, the JPA members requested future policy discussions regarding the JPA operating a public low cost, animal spay/neuter clinic and/or including a veterinarian as part of the shelter staff at the new facility.

Existing Program Overview:

Since August 10, 2006, the Yucca Valley Animal Shelter has utilized the services of various veterinary clinics, including a mobile spay/neuter clinic, for the purpose of altering the shelter's adoptable animals. A chart outlining the various veterinarians, locations, staff time, etc., during these times is attached to this memorandum.

Currently, the Yucca Valley Animal Shelter has been fortunate to use the services from Hi Desert Animal Hospital. A chart showing the associated costs and time spent for spaying and neutering the adoptable dogs and cats since 2006 is attached to this memo.

During the calendar year of 2009, 469 dogs and 161 cats were adopted from the Yucca Valley Animal Shelter. Approximately 14% (65) of the dogs and 13% (21) of the cats brought to the shelter were already altered. Current veterinarian service fees for altering a dog is \$81.00. Cats are \$55.00 each. Using these fees, the total costs for the spay/neuter services for 404 dogs and 140 cats would be \$40,479.00.

The animal shelter also incurs costs for the veterinarian treatment of injured/sick animals. The annual cost for this service is approximately \$1,000.00. This covers the examination of the animal and the veterinarian's prescribed type of treatment/medication. The prescribed medication which includes antibiotics, pain killer, wormers, subcutaneous fluid treatment, etc., is not included in the above costs.

Policy Discussion: Including a veterinarian in the structure of the future Animal Shelter:

Some of the larger humane centers and animal shelters employ or contract with veterinarians, primarily for diagnosis and treatment of the shelter's animals. The costs to employ a full time veterinarian averages approximately \$80,000.00 to \$100,000.00 or more per year. A veterinarian must also have a support staff to assist him/her for this service. At a minimum, the veterinarian's support staff would consist of one veterinarian technician and one clerical staff member

The costs to set up a surgical suite, depending on the quality of equipment purchased averages approximately \$10,000.00 to \$15,000.00. There must also be a "recovery" room for treated animals. The supplies required to maintain a surgical suite would average approximately \$7,000.00 annually, which does not include drugs used during the spay/neuter procedure. Other factors including in this type of operation include permits from the California Medical Board and an on-site permit from the DEA to purchase and use the Control substance type drugs (Tranquilizers, pain killers, euthanasia).

Operating a public, low cost spay & neuter clinic:

Low cost community spay/neuter clinics are generally funded and operated through non-profit organizations and/or licensed veterinarians. Local government agencies tend to not directly operate low cost spay/neuter clinics due to the high costs of providing this type of service, but instead support spay and neuter programs through efforts to reduce the costs of spay/neuter services, such as the County's voucher program.

In general, the medical responsibility of a spay/neuter clinic falls to the managing veterinarian since he/she is registered as the responsible party with the Department of Consumer Affairs. In addition to the needs and requirements identified previously in this memo, the JPA would need to increase the staffing level to include additional staff to support the public operation. For example, it takes five (5) to six (6) people to operate the mobile spay/neuter clinic owned by Animal Action League.

Summary: The costs to employ a veterinarian solely for addressing the needs of the future animal shelter exceed the costs of obtaining those services from local veterinarians. The costs to operate a public, low cost, spay/neuter clinic would increase annual operating costs of the future shelter significantly beyond projected annual operating costs. It is important to evaluate what other means are available to the JPA to reduce the costs of spay/neuter services for the community, such as the County's voucher program. Consideration should be given to a program similar to the County's to assist residents in reducing the costs of spay/neuter services, and thereby implementing efforts to reduce the population of unwanted animals.

*Staff time includes gathering up crates/blankets, putting the animals in the crates then into the van, driving the animals to the service, unloading the animals, and helping weigh each animal. When the animals are ready to be picked up, staff typically drives back to the clinic, loads the animals in the van, takes them back to the animal shelter, unloads the animals back into their cages, and feeding them. Crate cleaning is performed after these tasks are completed. There is also quite a bit of paperwork involved in this task which is performed prior to this event.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF YUCCA VALLEY, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING RESOLUTION 04-38 BY ADDING ANIMAL SHELTER SERVICE FEES FOR THE YUCCA VALLEY ANIMAL SHELTER

WHEREAS, the Town staff provides various services for the benefit of citizens and the community; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Yucca Valley provides Animal Shelter services to the community; and

WHEREAS, the cost of rendering such services, including boarding costs, impoundment costs, adoption fees, animal disposal, and euthanasia fees should be incurred by those utilizing such services which are provided by the Town's Animal Shelter facility; and

WHEREAS, data indicating the estimated costs of providing said services and the source of revenue required to defray such costs has been made available to the Town Council and to the public; and


WHEREAS, the recommended fees are less than total actual costs of providing the services as the fee calculations do not include overhead and do not include employee service benefits costs; and

WHEREAS, the fees are recommended are structured to encourage the adoption of animals while attaining a reasonable cost recovery process.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF YUCCA VALLEY, CALIFORNIA, RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS.

- Section 1:** The schedule of fees attached as Exhibit "A" hereto, is hereby approved and adopted.
- Section 2:** The fees approved and established herein shall become effective immediately unless otherwise required by law.
- Section 3:** All fees are automatically adjusted effective July 1st of each year based upon the CPI (Consumer Price Index) for County of San Bernardino, County of Riverside and County of Los Angeles.


